

THE FUN RISES IN THE EAST

HORACE GREELEY FAMOUSLY advised everybody to head west. From the look of I-70, that's just what they did. But sometimes it feels better to run away from the crowds, especially if you want to relax and enjoy yourself. So why not try a weekend in Morgan County, Colorado? It's just eighty miles east of Denver on I-76, out where the sky is big and the opportunities are even bigger. The South Platte River runs through here (p. 2), which is why the bison roamed nearby, and the

Arapahoe, Kiowa, Sioux, and Pawnee people called it a homeland. The great cattle drives stampeded through here (p. 3), and it's a migratory stopover for birds of all feathers (p. 5). The fish seem to like our rivers and lakes too, if you can believe the **anglers** who cast their lines here (p. 3). The great plains have their own chill and charm, with the majestic Pawnee Buttes rising among the wildflowers (p. 9), and the Dark Sky preserve at Jackson Lake State Park (p. 2) gives you

a view of a thousand points of light. But that isn't our only form of nightlife, with a **locavore restaurant movement** taking root in our fertile fields, and a **local winery** where you can sip and sample Morgan County vintages (**p. 7**). Head for the sunrise, and see what else is up in Morgan County.




I-76 Speedway

During the summer racing season (April to October), Fort Morgan's high-banked quartermile motorsport track lives by the slogan "Dirt Is Beautiful." Rainbow Bridge and Riverside Park Stroll across the South Platte on an historic span, then set up your picnic at Riverside Park.



Jackson Lake State Park | Welcome to our waters, kayakers and pleasure-craft captains! And when the sun goes down, settle in our campgrounds for s'mores, and for the stars that spangle our Dark Sky preserve.



Pawnee Grasslands Birding Tour | Bobwhite, quail, pheasants, lark buntings, waterfowl, and wild turkeys inhabit game preserves in Brush, Weldon Valley, and at the Jean K. Tool State Wildlife Area.





The Bobstock Music Festival | Every July, Fort Morgan's City Park features national headliners on three stages. Free admission. Tie-dye optional.



Disc Golf/Pickleball Heaven Optimist Disc Golf Course, Pessimist Disc Golf Course, and Watrous Park offer 54 holes to flip a disc. Or, hit the pickleball courts in Optimist Park, in Fort Morgan.



Brush Rodeo (4th of July) and the

Bucking Bull Battle (August) | Cowboys once roamed this range, and their skills are still celebrated in Brush every summer. Riders and bulls stampede in from all over the west to join the competition. You come too, and let loose your best "yeehaws."



A RIVER RUNS THROUGH US

THE SOUTH PLATTE RIVER STARTS HIGH in the Rocky Mountains and rolls 380 miles east across Colorado, nourishing the state's farm fields, providing drinking water, and offering wet-andwild recreation. The river is the lifeblood of Morgan County, touching all of the major towns and cities, from Orchard in the west, to Fort Morgan and Brush in the center, and to Hillrose out east. Settlers followed the South Platte seeking better lives, and you can make your own history along the river banks, tracing frontier heritage, seeing the wildlife, and exploring the waterways by boat, bicycle, or footpath. Make your splash on this stretch of the river and nearby waterways.

NATURE'S WATER PARK

A Jackson Lake State Park will slake your thirst for watery fun. The 2,500-acre reservoir and state park were originally a draw for hunters, but popular activities now include boating, off-road cycling and ATVs, birdwatching, camping, and swimming from its sandy beaches.

SEEING STARS

Jackson Lake State Park is a certified **Dark-Sky Park**, with limited artificial lighting that encourages astral tourism. Visit on any cloudless night and enjoy the star show.

NO BOAT? NO PROBLEM!

Shoreline Marina, on the west side of Jackson Lake, offers fishing gear and local insight on where they're biting. Call them at (970) 645-BOAT.

WALK ACROSS THE WATER

The 11-arch **Rainbow Bridge** spanned the South Platte in the 1920s. It's the gateway to Fort Morgan and the starting point of the Pawnee Pioneer Trails Scenic Byway. When a wider road bridge was installed next to it in the 1960s, the span was rededicated for pedestrians, who also enjoy Riverside Park on its south side and Twamore Trails on its north side. Your river stroll starts here.

A SHORE THING ON THE SOUTH PLATTE

B At the foot of the Rainbow Bridge and on the banks of the South Platte, **Riverside Park** is just the place to spread out a picnic and teach the kids how to skip a stone. Follow the park's walking path for more river views or stroll down the scenic paths on the north side of the river for additional glimpses of the water and wildlife.

WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE, IN MORGAN COUNTY

Where a river flows, wildlife is sure to follow, which is why Morgan County is home to a bounty of birds. wildflowers. and animals. The **Andrick Ponds** State Wildlife Area. on the west side of Jackson State Park, is a major stop on the Colorado Birding Trail, and there are deer, bobwhite quail, pheasants, waterfowl, and turkeys in preserves in Brush, Weldon Valley, and at the Jean K. Tool State Wildlife Area.




HIKE, BIKE, & ATV

C Looking for a great day hike? Hit the **Pawnee Buttes Trailhead** an hour north of Fort Morgan, in Grover, Colorado. **Road bikers** will enjoy flat terrain, miles of open road, and sweeping views in Morgan County. Watch ATV and motocross riders roar through **Sweney Cycle Park**, 31250 Co Rd G, in Brush. (Off-road racers can compete, as well.)

DISC GOLF PARADISE

D Care to flip a disc? The Optimist Disc Golf Course, at Riverside Park in Fort Morgan, has 27 rolling holes with water hazards. The Pessimist Disc Golf Course, 18 holes at 1511 Barlow Rd in Fort Morgan, runs along the South Platte River. Watrous Park, at 2810 Mill St in Brush, sports nine holes for disc golf.



FLOCK ON OVER

You're not the only eager visitor to eastern Colorado. Every year, the region is on the migratory flyway for a wide variety of birds, and they attract binoculartoting species as well. The first circuit on our birding tour begins in Briggsdale, Colorado, less than an hour northwest of Fort Morgan. Find Pawnee Grasslands Birding Tour on your smartphone, and follow the twohour route to spot Ferruginous Hawks, Lark Buntings, Burrowing Owls, and maybe a majestic Golden Eagle. The Brush Prairie Ponds, in Brush, flood in early summer, which attracts a flutter of migratory shorebirds, Lapland Longspurs, and in winter, Horned Larks. Another high-flying highlight is the Prairie Oases **Trail**, linking wetlands from Jackson Lake State Park, just north of Orchard, up to North Sterling State Park. Come on out, and make some fine-feathered friends. The incredible Great Blue Heron can be seen from the nature trails in Fort Morgan's **Riverview Park along the South** Platte River.



HAVE A (PICKLE) BALL WITH US

Pickleball was invented as a children's game in the 1960s, but why let kids have all the fun? Now it's one of the fastest growing sports in the country, and Optimist Park-1000 Vickie St, Fort Morgan-is in on the craze, with two courts. Bring your racquet, pickleball, and spirit of competition then bash away.

Round up your foursome and hit the Pickle Ball courts in Fort Morgan.

FUN, FESTIVALS, SHOPPING, AND FOOD!

ADVENTURES

A Looking for a fast start to your vacation? Head over to the I-76 Speedway, in Fort Morgan, where dirt-track racing is fast and furious from April to October. Or watch the mud fly at Sweney Cycle Park in Brush, where ATV and motocross competitors roar around a dirt track. Or you can actually fly like a bird—at Skydive Orange Skies, on Highway 52 in Fort Morgan. As Eddie Van Halen so memorably sang, "Just Jump!" They'll provide safe instruction, the plane, and a parachute!

FESTIVALS

^B Morgan County is all about home-made fun. July features two events unique to Morgan County. The Bobstock Music Festival, in Fort Morgan's City Park, has free admission and features national headliners on three stages. For more

traditional cattle-country entertainment, saddle up for the Brush Rodeo and Dance, which has been lighting up July 4th weekend for 65 vears. Or lock horns at the **Bucking Bull** Battle, held every August in Brush.

If you prefer your horsepower under the hood, rather than on the hoof, motor over to Fort Morgan's Fall Harvest Car Show. Also in September: Brush Octoberfest. Break out your lederhosen and dirndls, and help them roll out the barrel!

A ROAD TRIP TO PAWNEE BUTTES

Pack a picnic and drive an hour north to



the Pawnee National Grasslands, named for the First Nation people who inhabited this land long before the settlers arrived. The **Pawnee Buttes trail** will lead you out among the hawks and wildflowers, until you spot the two striking stone towers that rise 300 feet above the prairie. Scan the QR code for more details.

→ Provision your Picnic at the Edwards Right Price Market (Fort Morgan's fine-foods market, at 1201 E Platte Ave) or the Fort Morgan Mini Halal Market (specialty foods, including Somali cuisine, at 410 E Railroad Ave).
